**1. (STATEMENT SOUGHT FROM THE CHAIR COMMITTEE ON
EDUCATION, ICT, VOCATIONAL TRAINING AND LIBRARY SERVICES)**

Hon. Speaker, Pursuant to Standing Order 47(1) (c), I Wish to request a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Education, ICT, Vocational training and Library Services regarding Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) Institutions in the County.

Hon. Speaker, Article 53 1 (b) of the Constitution of Kenya (2010) ensures that every child has the right to free and compulsory basic education. This includes a right to access quality secondary and post-secondary education, which can encompass TVET programs.

Hon Speaker, Article 55 of COK 2010 states that the government's responsibility to ensure the youth (defined as individuals between the ages of 15 and 35 years) are empowered through education and training. The State shall take measures to ensure that young people have access to relevant education, training and opportunities for employment and self-employment.

Hon speaker, TVET institutions play a crucial role in providing technical and vocational training to the youth, helping to equip them with the necessary skills for employment and entrepreneurship.

Hon Speaker, these institutions aim to address the skills gap in the region and contribute to economic development by offering courses that are aligned with local industry needs. Additionally, they help in reducing unemployment rates and fostering self-reliance among the youth.

Hon Speaker, the chairperson should inquire into and report on;

1. How does TVET address the skills gap in various industries?
2. What are the challenges faced by TVET institutions in maintaining quality standards?
3. What is the enrollment rate for students in these institutions?
4. How do the TVET institutions contribute to reducing unemployment in the region?
5. In what ways can TVET institutions enhance economic growth and development?

4. Can the department provide a detailed report on the total income generated from Agricultural machines over the past year?
5. What specific plans are in place to ensure that agricultural machinery remains well-maintained and operational?
6. What measures have been implemented to improve the timeliness of machinery service and repair, and how does the department ensure that farmers are not faced with significant delays during peak agricultural seasons?
7. How does the department assess the adequacy and modernity of the machinery available to farmers? Are there any plans to upgrade or expand the fleet to meet the needs of modern agricultural practices?
8. Given the increasing focus on sustainable agriculture, what steps are being taken to ensure that the machinery services provided are aligned with environmental goals, such as reducing emissions and fuel consumption?
9. What key performance indicators (KPIs) are being used to measure the efficiency and success of agricultural machinery services? How often are these metrics reviewed, and are they publicly accessible?
