1.(STATEMENT SOUGHT FROM THE CHAIR COMMITTEE ON WATER AND IRRIGATION SERVICES)

Honorable Speaker,

Pursuant to Standing Order 47(1)(c), I rise to request a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Water and irrigation Services regarding the breakdown of the borehole in Kasha and Derderey villages, Saka Ward, and the urgent need for water trucking, especially during the holy month of Ramadan.

Honorable Speaker, access to clean and safe water is a fundamental right enshrined under Article 43(1)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010. Additionally, the provision of water services is a devolved function under Article 191, placing the responsibility on the County Government to ensure adequate and sustainable water supply for all residents.

Honorable Speaker, the residents of Kasha and Derderey villages are facing an extreme water crisis due to the breakdown of the borehole, exacerbating hardships during the holy month of Ramadan. The situation has severely impacted daily life, making it difficult for the community to access clean drinking water, prepare meals, and observe religious obligations. The lack of water has also posed serious health and sanitation risks, making immediate intervention necessary.

Honorable Speaker, given the urgency of the matter, the Chairperson should inquire into and report on:

1. Whether the Department is aware of the borehole breakdown in Kasha and Derderey villages in Saka Ward. If so, what immediate steps have been taken to restore water supply?
2. The expected timeline for repairing the borehole and ensuring sustainable water access in the affected villages?
3. When the Department plans to commence water trucking to alleviate the suffering of residents, particularly during the holy month of Ramadan?
4. The long-term measures the Department is implementing to prevent recurrent water shortages in kasha and derderey village Saka Ward?
