7*. Questions and Statements*

1.(STATEMENT SOUGHT FROM THE CHAIR COMMITTEE ON COUNTY AFFAIRS, PUBLIC SERVICE AND INTERGORVERNMENTAL RELATIONS)

Hon. Speaker,

Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 47(2)(c) and in exercise of my oversight mandate under Article 185(3) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, I rise to seek a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on County Affairs, Public service and Intergovernmental Relations regarding the non-payment of salary to Mr. Ahmed Abdi Amud, a teacher employed by the County Service Public Board (CSPB) and posted to Labin Qolow Primary School.

Hon. Speaker, Mr. Ahmed Abdi Amud, TSC No. **884549**, was employed on 20th June 2025 as an ECD teacher. However, since his employment, he has not received his salary for the months of July, August, and September 2025. This delay has caused him significant financial hardship despite diligently discharging his teaching duties at the said institution.

Hon. Speaker, failure to pay a public officer their due salary is inconsistent with Article 41(1) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, which guarantees every worker the right to fair labour practices, including timely payment of remuneration. It also contravenes the provisions of the Employment Act, 2007, which obligates employers to pay wages promptly for work done.

Hon. Speaker, considering the critical role teachers play in nurturing the education and development of our children, it is imperative that this matter be resolved urgently to ensure the affected officer receives his rightful dues without further delay.

Hon. Speaker, in the Statement the Chairperson should inquire into and reports on:

1. What specific reasons account for the three-month delay in payment of salary to Mr. Ahmed Abdi Amud (TSC No. 884549)?
2. Has his appointment and details submitted to the relevant payroll department for payment?
3. When is the relevant authority expected to effect payment of the pending salary arrears?
4. What measures have been put in place to ensure that newly recruited officers do not experience similar delays in salary payments in the future?

4. What safeguards have been established to guarantee that the uji (porridge) supplied under the feeding programme meets national health, safety and nutrition standards for young learners, as required by the Public Health Act and other applicable regulations?

4 .(STATEMENT SOUGHT FROM THE CHAIR COMMITTEE ON WATER AND IRRIGATION SERVICE)

Hon. Speaker, Pursuant to Standing Order 47(2)(c) and in exercise of my oversight mandate under Article 185(3) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, I rise to seek a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Water and Irrigation Services regarding the status of water access and the rehabilitation of boreholes in Saka Ward, with specific reference to the Derderey Borehole and the Fatuma Golicha Borehole.

Hon. Speaker, access to clean and safe water is a fundamental human right as guaranteed under Article 43(1)(d) of the Constitution, which provides that every person has the right to clean and safe water in adequate quantities. This right is not discretionary; it imposes a binding obligation on both the National and County Governments to ensure the availability, accessibility, and sustainability of water services for all citizens.

This constitutional imperative is further reinforced by key legislative and policy frameworks, including:

- Article 21(2) of the Constitution, which obliges the State to take legislative, policy, and other measures to achieve the progressive realization of economic and social rights.
- Article 56(c), which provides for affirmative action measures to ensure that marginalized and minority groups have access to essential services, including water.
- The Fourth Schedule, Part 2(11), which assigns County Governments the responsibility for water and sanitation services.
- Section 63 of the Water Act, 2016, which mandates County Governments to ensure the provision of water services within their jurisdictions.

- The Public Health Act (Cap. 242), which requires public authorities to ensure that water supplied for human consumption meets national health and safety standards.
- Section 104 of the County Governments Act, 2012, which requires county departments to plan and implement development priorities addressing the basic needs of citizens, including access to water.

Hon. Speaker, the residents of Saka Ward, particularly those in Derderey Village and Fatuma Golicha Centre, are currently facing acute water shortages due to the breakdown and non-functionality of vital boreholes serving these communities. The Derderey Borehole has remained non-operational for an extended period, depriving residents and their livestock of a reliable source of water. Similarly, the borehole at Fatuma Golicha Centre remains unequipped and unrehabilitated, thereby worsening the ongoing water crisis.

This situation has caused significant hardship to residents, especially women, children, and pastoral households, who are forced to walk long distances in search of water. It has further exposed them to risks associated with dehydration, waterborne diseases, and the loss of livelihoods. The crisis undermines the constitutional right to water, threatens public health, and destabilizes the socio-economic well-being of the affected communities.

It is therefore imperative that the department of water and irrigation Services takes immediate and comprehensive remedial measures to restore and sustain water access in Derderey Village and Fatuma Golicha Centre, in line with its constitutional and statutory responsibilities.

Hon. Speaker, in the statement the chairperson should inquire into and report on;

1. Whether the Department is aware of the acute water shortage currently affecting residents of Derderey Village in Saka Ward due to the non-functionality of the Derderey Borehole, and what specific plans, timelines and resources have been put in place to ensure its prompt repair and restoration?
2. Whether the Department is aware of the current status of the borehole at Fatuma Golicha Centre in Saka Ward, which remains unequipped and in need of rehabilitation, and what measures have been initiated or scheduled to ensure its full rehabilitation and operationalization to provide sustainable access to clean and safe water for the residents?

5. (STATEMENT SOUGHT FROM THE CHAIR COMMITTEE ON HEALTH)

Hon. Speaker, Pursuant to Standing Order 47(2)(c) and in the execution of my oversight mandate under Article 185(3) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, I rise to seek a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Health Services regarding the status of incomplete maternity infrastructure projects in Saka Ward, specifically at Saka Health Centre and Hadley Dispensary, as well as the planned construction of a maternity wing at Kasha Health Centre, which was allocated funds in the County Budget for the Financial Year 2025/2026.

Hon. Speaker, access to quality, reliable and equitable maternal healthcare is a constitutional right and a key pillar of public health. Article 43(1)(a) of the Constitution guarantees every person the right to the highest attainable standard of health, including reproductive healthcare. This right is not aspirational, it imposes a direct and actionable obligation on both levels of government to ensure that health facilities are functional, adequately equipped and accessible to all citizens.

This constitutional duty is further underpinned by several legislative and policy frameworks, including;

- Article 21(2) of the Constitution, which requires the State to take legislative, policy, and other measures to achieve the progressive realization of economic and social rights, including the right to health;
- The Fourth Schedule, Part 2(2) of the Constitution, which assigns County Governments the responsibility for County health services, including County hospitals, dispensaries, and health centres;
- Section 5(1)(a) of the Health Act, 2017, which mandates the national and county governments to ensure access to promotive, preventive, curative, palliative, and rehabilitative health services;
- Section 102(1)(c) of the County Governments Act, 2012, which obliges counties to plan for equitable social and economic development, including health infrastructure; and
- The Public Finance Management Act, 2012, which requires transparency, accountability, and efficiency in the management of public resources, particularly funds allocated to health projects.

Hon. Speaker, despite these clear constitutional and statutory obligations, several key maternity infrastructure projects within Saka Ward remain incomplete or unimplemented.

The maternity facilities at Saka Health Centre and Hadley Dispensary have remained unfinished for a prolonged period, thereby denying residents, especially expectant mothers access to essential maternal and neonatal services. Similarly, while funds were duly allocated in the FY 2025/2026 County Budget for the construction of a maternity wing at Kasha Health Centre, there is no visible progress on advertisement, procurement or commencement of works.

Hon Speaker, this state of delay and non-completion undermines the right to healthcare, exposes mothers and infants to preventable risks, and erodes public confidence in the health delivery system. Urgent attention is therefore required to ensure that all maternity infrastructure projects are completed and operationalized in good time, consistent with the principles of efficiency, accountability, and equitable service delivery under Article 10 of the Constitution.

Hon. Speaker, in the statement the chairperson should inquire into and report on;

1. Whether the Department is aware of the incomplete maternity projects at Saka Health Centre and Hadley Dispensary, and what specific timelines, action plans and resource allocations have been established to ensure their completion and operationalization?
2. Whether the Department could clarify when it intends to advertise, procure and commence the construction of the maternity wing at Kasha Health Centre, which was allocated funds in the County Budget for the Financial Year 2025/2026, and what measures are in place to guarantee timely implementation and quality assurance?
